CO DRINKING WATER QUALITY


Each year, DC Water tests > 5,000 water samples from hydrants, residences and commercial buildings.

Recent results show the lowest lead levels measured in the last decade (4 ppb).

Since 2004, replaced more than 19,000 lead service pipes on public property.

dc water distribution system

Pump 95 million gallons a day through 1,350 miles of pipes, 4 pumping stations and other infrastructure





enough pipes to stretch from DC to Oklahoma City

(about a 20 hour drive)

dc WASTEWATER COLLECTION SYSTEM

1,900 miles of sewers (to collect sewage and stormwater and convey it to Blue Plains)





enough pipes to stretch from DC to Albuquerque

(about a 27 hour drive)

Treats an average of 300 million gallons per day

AGING INFRASTRUCTURE

MEDIAN AGE OF WATER MAINS IS 79 YEARS OLD

Half installed before 1936
Oldest date back to the Civil War



SYSTEM UPGRADES

- Replacing I percent of water mains/year
- \$40 million/year
- In FY 2016, separating out cost of replacing aging pipes (Water System Replacement Fee)
- Ensure stable, dedicated funding source for this effort

dC Doing more with your dollar

CIPP sewer lateral repair trenchless technology

- Minimal customer disruption
- No excavation
- Extended service life
- Program saved ratepayers \$1.3 million in 2015

Multi-year rates

- Predictable rates allow customers to plan
- Increases budget discipline water and sewer rate increase limited to 5% for FY17 & FY18
- Favored by credit rating agencies lower borrowing costs

Bailey Bioenergy Facility

- Reduced biosolids hauling from 55 truck loads per day to 20 truck loads per day.
- Reduction saves over \$10 million per year




If you make improvements to reduce stormwater runoff...
